

The cabin is an excellent centre from which to explore Wester Ross. The coastal road to Applecross provides outstanding views over land and sea. After Applecross, the road continues over the Bealach na Ba, which is very steep and winding, but well worth the effort on a clear day to take in the all round views of the Hebridean Islands and the distant mainland mountains.

This entire area is a paradise for hill walkers, from a gentle stroll at sea level to ridge walking on the high Torridon Mountains.

Sea angling is on the doorstep with freshwater fishing nearby in burns and hill lochs.

Seals, otters, pine marten may be from the cabin. The woods, shore, mountains and hillsides provide habitat for many birds, from Goldcrests to Golden Eagles and Sandpipers to Sea Eagles.

We have been involved in several Agri-Environmental schemes, including 50 hectares of Native Woodland containing Caledonian pine, alder, birch, holly and rowan.

Bird watchers, painters, photographers, geologists, hillwalkers, sailors and those looking for peace and quiet, will all be enthralled in this area.

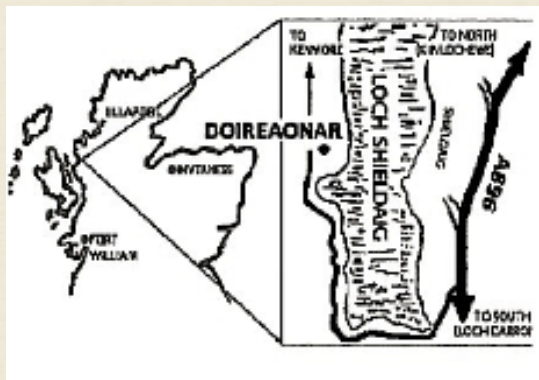

Accommodation comprises one double bedroom and one twin bedded room; a shower room with toilet, wash-hand basin and separate sauna; a fully equipped fitted kitchen area with gas cooker, washing machine, fridge-freezer and an open plan dining/lounge area with a log burning fire.

Wet gear can also be hung up here to dry under the verandah roof and outdoor wear can be stowed in the entrance porch.
